**Background:** Deg1 is a nuclear gene encoding chloroplast-targeted protease that can

degrade two lumenal proteins, plastocyanin and OE33, suggesting a role as a

general-purpose protease in the thylakoid lumen. It is involved in the

degradation of D1 protein of PS II, hence participating in the repair of PS II

damages caused by photoinhibition.

**Reconstitution:** Reconstitution with 150 µl of sterile water.

"Note: please spin tube briefly prior to opening it to avoid any losses that might

occur from lyophilized material adhering to the cap or sides of the tube".

**Stability &**Use a manual defrost freezer and avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.

Storage: 12 months from date of receipt, -20 to -70°C as supplied.

6 months, -20 to -70°C under sterile conditions after reconstitution.

1 month, 2 to 8°C under sterile conditions after reconstitution.

**Shipping:** The product is shipped at 4°C. Upon receipt, store it immediately at the

temperature recommended above.

Among species analyzed, the sequence of the synthetic peptide used for immunization is 80-99% homologues with the sequence in Brassica napus, Brassica rapa, Cucumis sativus, Spinacia oleracea, Zea mays, Sorghum bicolor, Medicago truncatula, Nicotiana tabacum, Solanum tuberosum, Solanum lycopersicum, Populus trichocarpa, Setaria viridis, Panicum virgatum, Oryza sativa, Triticum aestivum, Hordeum vulgare.
